NTT DOCOMO USA, Inc. recently discovered that, on April 26, 2013, due to an unauthorized external access to our server from an outside source, information pertaining to some of our DOCOMO USA Wireless™ subscribers was accessed. Through our investigation, we have determined that the personal information involved in this incident included name and payment card information. We deeply regret that this incident occurred and take very seriously the security of personal information.

We are working with law enforcement and are taking measure to prevent this type of attack in the future.

As a precaution, we have arranged for you, at your option, to enroll in a complimentary 12 month credit monitoring service. We have engaged Experian Consumer Direct to provide you with its ProtectMyID Alettr 3B, which consists of: 1) Credit Report: A free copy of your Experian credit report; 2) Daily 3 Bureau Credit Monitoring: Alerts you of suspicious activity including new inquiries, newly opened accounts, delinquencies, or medical collections found on your Experian, Equifax® and TransUnion® credit reports; 3) Identity Theft Resolution: If you have been a victim of identity theft, you will be assigned a dedicated, U.S.-based Experian Identity Theft Resolution Agent who will walk you through the fraud resolution process, from start to finish; 4) ExtendCARE: Full access to the same personalized assistance from a highly-trained Fraud Resolution Agent even after your initial ProtectMyID membership expires; 5) \$1 Million Identity Theft Insurance*: As a ProtectMyID member, you are immediately covered by a \$1 Million insurance policy that can help you cover certain costs including, lost wages, private investigator fees, and unauthorized electronic fund transfers. Until June 30, 2013, you can activate the free credit monitoring service by using the following activation code: [Active Code]. This code is unique for your use and should not be shared. To enroll, please go to www.protectmyid.com/redeem or call 877-371-7902. Also, you need to have a US credit file.
