ORDER

Following a hearing on December 15, 2010, the court finds as follows:

Donald Bevins and Twin City Roofing Company, Inc. and several similarly named entities entered into a consent judgment on June 11, 2009, which contained specific provisions intended to protect the public from home improvement fraud and provide for restitution to victims. On November 2, 2009, the court found Mr. Bevins and his companies in contempt for failing to comply with the June 11, 2009 order. Additional requirements were added.

Except for the execution of a mortgage on his residence, Mr. Bevins has failed to comply with any of the provisions of the original consent judgment or the November contempt order. In his testimony today, he stated that he had no recollection of the promises he made and had no understanding of his obligation to the state.

The court finds that Mr. Bevins is in willful contempt of the June 11 and November 2 orders. He has continued to work as a roofer and by his own testimony undertook multiple jobs during 2010. He has made none of the payments required by the previous consent order and has complied with none of the consumer protection requirements of the order. For this reason, the court ORDERS as follows:

1. Donald Bevins shall not enter into any contract for home repair, including roofing work. He shall not contract either as an individual or as a representative of Twin City Roofing, Inc. or any other corporation.
2. Donald Bevins shall not set foot on any work site where roofing work is underway.
3. Donald Bevins is completely barred at this time from working as a roofing contractor in any manner whatsoever.

At the hearing today, the court advised Mr. Bevins that failure to comply with this order is likely to result in sanctions from the court, including incarceration (jail).
