You will notice that there is no audio for the first 30 seconds of the body cam footage, and no audio for the cell footage. That is because there is no audio on the cell camera and the audio on the body cam is on a 30-second delay, so the audio was not redacted in any way, it simply doesn't exist. The only redaction is in obscuring the victim's face, and attached is a letter explaining the rationale for this redaction.

I write in response to your Public Records Act request dated August 8, 2023, in which you request:

“Any and all audio and video taken from the St. Albans police station and officer body camera footage of the incident Nov 26, 2017, involving Officer Joel Daugreilh of the St Albans Police Department leading to the criminal charge against him”.

A link to a SharePoint site containing the body camera footage of the incident that you requested has been sent to you by email. Please note that the records you have requested have been redacted pursuant to the following statutory exemptions:

- 1 V.S.A. § 317(c)(5)(A)(iii) - Records dealing with the detection and investigation of crime that could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.
