The Vermont Legislature enacted Act 41 in 2023 requiring a study reviewing towing practices in Vermont, along with recommendations for action or reform deemed appropriate by the Attorney General after consultation with agency and other stakeholders.

Public hearing was held in November. Interested parties and stakeholder agencies were invited and encouraged to submit relevant materials on the topic. We are still receiving materials as of late this week, the submission deadline.

Given interest in the topic and with knowledge that all materials must be reviewed – and, because we have yet to hear from all interested parties and/or stakeholders who may yet wish to comment, the Office of the Attorney General shall issue its final report and recommendations on or about January 31, 2023 in the interest of transparency and full consideration of all materials submitted and received.
