Thank you for your public records request dated July 31, 2024, in which you requested:

“The duration and type of award, i.e., “IDIQ” or a specific time frame, the award amount(s), brand(s), model(s) number(s) and or type(s) of mobile device(s) pertaining to sexual assault kit tracking...

the number of rape kits collected and booked into police evidence since 2020
the number of rape kits that have been processed by a public or private crime or forensic laboratory since 2020
the number of unprocessed rape kits in any storage facilities currently under the department’s jurisdiction and control
any documentation providing the reason(s) unprocessed kits were not processed
the number of rape kits destroyed or lost
any written policies or procedures regarding department practices on the handling of rape kit evidence, including testing protocols”
