

Narrative:

On Thursday, September 20, 2018, at approximately 2125 hours, I responded to a report of people knocking on the door and running away from of [REDACTED] in Bennington, Vermont.

When I arrived, I searched the cemetery with my vehicle's scene lights, illuminating as much of the area as I could. I did not observe anyone in the cemetery. As I was in the cemetery, I was notified that a truck, possibly a lifted Toyota, sped away from in front of [REDACTED]. I did not see or hear any vehicles "burning out" or driving in an erratic manner from the cemetery.

I searched the length of [REDACTED] and did not locate any vehicles matching that description.

I returned to the cemetery and searched it again, and again I did not locate anyone in the cemetery. I then positioned my vehicle so that I was not easily visible from the road, but I could still observe the residence of [REDACTED]. After approximately 10 minutes of continuous observation, I was notified that the knocking happened again approximately 10 minutes ago. I had not observed any activity in that time period.

At that time, I exited my vehicle and moved to a location closer to the residence, under the concealment of a large tree. After approximately 10 to 15 minutes, I observed what appeared to be a juvenile tip-toe onto the porch of [REDACTED] knock on the door once, and run back into the cemetery.

I approached the area where the juvenile ran, and located two juvenile males, who identified themselves verbally as [REDACTED], DOB [REDACTED], and [REDACTED], DOB [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was out of breath and the same height and build of the juvenile I had observed knock on the door. Both denied being involved in the activity, claiming they saw another juvenile in the area. A preliminary search yielded no other juveniles. Both juveniles advised they were there to meet someone, but could not expound upon that. I believed that these two were more likely than not the two juveniles committing the nuisance. I told the two to leave and discontinue their behavior.

I later found out that [REDACTED] mother resides nearby, at [REDACTED]. I met with the residents of [REDACTED], James Lawton and Ruqiyah Morse. Lawton advised me that this is not the first night that this had happened, and he has chased juveniles down the road with his dog before. Lawton explained that juveniles have knocked on their doors and windows, putting him and Morse at their wit's end. I advised Lawton I identified the juveniles and dispersed them from the area. Lawton advised he wanted more done than just a talking to because of the stress it put him under. Lawton advised he and Morse would likely be leaving the house, going to a hotel for the night. I advised them I did not

think that was necessary as it appeared to be a juvenile prank, but it was their decision.

I checked the cemetery again, and did not locate anyone.

This ends my involvement.

SUPPLEMENTAL NARRATIVE---FADEN

On September 22nd, 2018, at approximately 0012 hours, I was dispatched with Officer Osgood to a report of kids banging on a window at [REDACTED].

I had been advised that there was a problem earlier in the night with kids banging on the windows and running away. Upon arrival this officer and officer Osgood searched the area. Also searched was the [REDACTED] Cemetery which is across the street from the home. No kids were observed in the area at all. Officer Osgood interviewed the complainant in the presence of this officer.

I advised Officer Osgood to hide his vehicle down the road and walk back to the cemetery. I advised Officer Osgood to hide in the cemetery in hopes of catching the kids if they returned to prank the home again. Knocking on doors and running away is a common prank done by kids in town. Due to the [REDACTED] cemetery being close to the downtown area it is frequented by juveniles.

Officer Osgood and this officer hid in the area but did not observed any juveniles in the area. Both Officer Osgood and I were in and out of the area looking until after 2 am.

SUSPICIOUS

On Friday, September 21st, 2018, at approximately 2228 hours, I was dispatched to [REDACTED], in Bennington VT, for a report of someone banging on the complainant, [REDACTED] windows.

Upon arrival, I noticed a neighbor (later identified as [REDACTED]) near his house ([REDACTED]). [REDACTED] was carrying a very large metal tool and advised that he had just heard a loud bang and loud yelling coming from his neighbor's house of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me that he came outside to see what was going on.

I spoke with the complainant, [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me that multiple young adult aged boys were banging on her windows and yelling at her. [REDACTED] advised that she yelled at them to leave and the boys yelled obscenities at her and ran into the cemetery. [REDACTED] advised that juveniles have been harassing her neighbor's house as well.

As I was speaking with the neighbor and [REDACTED], dispatch advised that they had received a second call from [REDACTED] advising that residents of [REDACTED] could hear gun shots and an argument coming from the area of [REDACTED] and the cemetery.

I searched the cemetery on foot, I could see faint remnants of smoke. No wrappers from fireworks were found in the cemetery. It should be noted that the sky was clear and that no fog was present at this time of night.

At the rear of the cemetery, I noticed a seven foot fence chained at the gate. As my flashlight searched the cemetery, a male juvenile's voice was heard yelling to me when my flashlight was moved away from the fence. The comments were hard to understand but I could clearly hear "bitch" being called out to me. After shinning my flashlight through the fence a few times and listening to the juveniles call out to me, I was able to locate two juvenile boys in their teens hiding behind a large oak tree on the other side of the fence, located in the park next to the old Stewart's building. I requested the assistance of Officer Sharshon and Officer Legacy and started making my way closer. As I got close to the fence, the two juveniles were seen running east down Main street, in the direction of Union Street. The juvenile's turned the corner and were no longer in sight. The juvenile that called out to me can be described as having dirty blonde or brownish hair, a tall skinny build, a dark blue shirt on and khaki shorts. The second juvenile was hiding behind the first juvenile and is described as shorter than the first juvenile, with a skinny build and a hooded sweatshirt.

Sheriff Deputy Doucette arrived on scene as the juvenile's were running in the opposite direction. Sheriff Deputy Doucette was unable to locate the juveniles. I then searched the remainder of the cemetery and did not locate anyone else.

A short time later, Officer Legacy located four juveniles at the new Stewart's Shop on Main Street. The juveniles were later identified as [redacted] dob [redacted] [redacted] dob [redacted] [redacted] dob [redacted] and [redacted] [redacted] dob [redacted]. Officer Legacy called me to Stewart's Shop to see if any of the juveniles matched the description of the juveniles from the cemetery.

Upon arrival, I was able to determine that none of the juveniles at the Stewart's Shop matched the description of the juveniles that had ran from me. The juveniles explained that they had heard the gun shots but denied being a part of the harassment on [redacted]. The juveniles all advised that they were hanging out with [redacted] (dob [redacted]) and were supposed to be staying the night at his residence. It should be noted that [redacted] was not one of the juvenile's at Stewart's Shop and the juvenile's present were unable to tell me where he was.

Witness Beth Cameron dob [redacted] came over and advised that she had seen [redacted] running towards the Stewart's Shop and [redacted] running in the direction of the cemetery minutes before the police drove by on their way to the cemetery.

Later that evening, I received a phone call from Deputy Doucette who advised that he had located juveniles matching the description I had given out on Pleasant Street. Deputy Doucette spoke with these juveniles and identified them as [redacted] dob [redacted] and [redacted] dob [redacted]. The juveniles admitted to being in the area around the time of this incident and Deputy Doucette advised that [redacted] was wearing a blue shirt and khaki shorts. It was later learned that these two juveniles, [redacted] and [redacted] were not involved in this incident.

The following day, (09/22/2018) I traveled to [redacted] residence at [redacted] in Bennington VT. [redacted] parents were present as he was being questioned. After discussing with [redacted] the severity of this case and how it was important to identify the juveniles responsible, [redacted] reluctantly shared that he had been part of the group that had "ding, dong, ditched" the white house on [redacted]. [redacted] told me that on Thursday, September 20th, 2018, [redacted] dob [redacted] and [redacted] dob [redacted] "ding, dong ditched" the brown house on [redacted].

[redacted] advised that no one knew who lived in the brown house but explained that [redacted] and [redacted] thought it was funny.

[redacted] explained that the following night, (09/22/2018) [redacted] and [redacted] returned to the brown house with [redacted] to "ding, dong, ditch" the brown house again. [redacted] told me that when the seven juvenile's arrived in the cemetery, they discovered the residents of [redacted] were not home. [redacted] explained that because the residents of [redacted] were not home, the juveniles decided to go to [redacted] or what [redacted] referred to as "the white house".

[redacted] told me that [redacted] and himself were the ones who punched the white house. [redacted] told me that [redacted] did not punch the house but were hiding in the cemetery at the time.

[redacted] advised that the women from the white house came outside with a gun and

yelled to the boys, "you little motherfuckers, I'll shoot you" and shot two shots into the air, pointed in the direction of the cemetery where the boys were hiding. [REDACTED] said he saw the gun the women was holding and described it as a long gun or rifle. [REDACTED] told me that he saw the women shoot into the air pointed above the cemetery. [REDACTED] advised that when the women fired the first shot, he saw a flare come out of the muzzle of the gun. [REDACTED] said after the first shot everyone ran into cemetery and he heard a second gun shot. [REDACTED] advised that everyone jumped the fence or crawled through a small gap in the fence and took off in the direction of Main Street. [REDACTED] explained that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were the two juveniles standing behind the large tree yelling to me. [REDACTED] told me that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] thought that I was the woman who came out of the white house with the gun. [REDACTED] provided me with a sworn written statement.

After speaking with [REDACTED], I traveled back to [REDACTED] and spoke with the homeowner [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] agreed to have all of the juveniles served with No Trespass Orders.

After [REDACTED] signed the No Trespass Orders for all seven juveniles, Officer Legacy traveled to [REDACTED] residence to serve the No Trespass Order. [REDACTED] provided Officer Legacy with a sworn written statement and explained how the boys were shot at and how they ran away into the cemetery. [REDACTED] told Officer Legacy that he thought the gun was a BB gun and advised that it was rifle shaped and sounded like a BB gun. [REDACTED] explained that about 20 minutes later, two of the boys returned to the house.

While Officer Legacy was serving the No Trespass Order on [REDACTED], I traveled to [REDACTED] residence ([REDACTED]). [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were also at this residence. [REDACTED] was served a No Trespass Order and agreed to provide a sworn written statement with his mother present. It should be noted that [REDACTED] fit the description of the juvenile that had called out to me from behind the tree the night before.

[REDACTED] told me that he "ding, dong, ditched" the brown house on [REDACTED] Street [REDACTED] two nights before (9/20/2018). When asked why he choose this house, [REDACTED] explained that he did not know who lived at the residence but advised that the residents had closed the curtains on them while they were hanging out in the cemetery at an earlier time.

[REDACTED] explained that they boys returned, this time with more boys and choose the white house on [REDACTED] to "ding, dong, ditch" because the residents of [REDACTED] were not home. [REDACTED] advised that when they pounded on the white house, a middle aged women came outside with a black gun (what he described as a shotgun) and yelled to the boys saying she would shot them. [REDACTED] advised that she shot at the boys and they all took off running into the cemetery. [REDACTED] explained that he believed she shot at them again because he told me he heard a second gun shot. [REDACTED] admitted to being the one who called out to me when I was searching the cemetery and advised that he had thought I was the lady with the gun. [REDACTED] denied going back to [REDACTED] a second time, refer to related incident # 18BN07203.

Officer Legacy assisted at [REDACTED] residence and served [REDACTED] a No Trespass Order with [REDACTED] parents present at the time.

[REDACTED] was transported to his home of [REDACTED] by this Officer. [REDACTED] was issued a No Trespass Order with his mother present.

The following day (09/24/2018), [REDACTED] were issued No Trespass Orders. [REDACTED] denied being present at the time of the "ding, dong, ditching" and explained that he was at [REDACTED] house at the time. It should be noted that [REDACTED] admitted a day prior that [REDACTED] was present at the time of the pranks and was one of the juveniles banging on the house. It should also be noted that [REDACTED] told me that [REDACTED] were not involved at all in the pranks.

I made contact with [REDACTED] mother, who brought [REDACTED] to the Bennington Police Department to accept his No Trespass Order. [REDACTED] signed for his No Trespass Order with his mother present. [REDACTED] corroborated the juveniles story and advised that the women who shot at the boys was [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] mother advised that the family personally knows [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told me that he did not know that the white house was [REDACTED] on the night of the incident.

After all seven juveniles were served No Trespass Orders, I traveled back to [REDACTED] and gained a sworn written statement from neighbor [REDACTED].

After speaking with [REDACTED] I spoke with [REDACTED] who also agreed to provide a sworn written statement.

[REDACTED] was questioned about the guns inside her residence. [REDACTED] advised that she only owns BB guns and showed me a Crosman Pellet gun (long rifle style, model number 760 Pumpmaster) and an all black BB gun pistol. It should be noted that the long rifle BB gun was all black in color and resembled a hunting rifle.

[REDACTED] went into more detail and told me that on the night of the incident (9/21/2018) she had four children inside the residence. [REDACTED] explained that around 2226 hours, she called the police because someone was aggressively banging on her windows. [REDACTED] advised that she stood on her porch yelling at the individuals to stay off her property. [REDACTED] admitted to having the black BB long rifle in her hands at the time. [REDACTED] told me that the juveniles yelled back at her cursing and threatening her and she admitted to shooting the BB gun one time into the air above the cemetery. [REDACTED] was clear that she did not want to hit the individuals and aimed in the air above them.

Persons from [REDACTED] heard loud gun shots coming from the area of Ericca's residence at the time of the incident. It should be noted that [REDACTED] is approximately 600 feet away from [REDACTED] residence [REDACTED] reported using a BB gun. BB guns do not make the same amount of noise as a rifle or shotgun and do not emit sparks or flashes when fired. It should also be noted that [REDACTED] reported seeing a flare come out of the muzzle of the gun.

[REDACTED] told me that around 0006 hours on 09/22, she heard two voices talking and then heard three more bangs on her window. [REDACTED] advised that she did report this to the police. Refer to related incident # 18BN07203.

On September 24th, 2018, this case was sent to the Bennington State's Attorney's Office for case review.

ATV INCIDENT

On September 29th, 2018, at approximately 0343 hours, I was dispatched to the area of [REDACTED] near the [REDACTED] cemetery for a report of a loud all terrain vehicle being ridden in that area.

While responding I was waved down by an unknown male at the intersection of Main Street and [REDACTED]. The male appeared to be very agitated and stated that a very loud dirt bike had just come up Main Street very fast and then went up [REDACTED]. I drove up [REDACTED] and entered the cemetery. I searched the cemetery but did not see any off road vehicles. I then went to Imperial Avenue and observed several 4 wheeled ATV's at the residence of [REDACTED].

As I pulled up to the front of the house I observed [REDACTED] standing at the front porch of the house. I could see that [REDACTED] had a dirt bike helmet on. I asked to speak to [REDACTED] and he said, "Sure as long as you don't come on my property." I asked [REDACTED] why he was driving down the road on a dirt bike and he denied doing this. [REDACTED] then became belligerent and began ordering me to leave his home as he retreated inside. I advised [REDACTED] that I would be mailing him tickets for driving the dirt bike on the road. I could see that [REDACTED] was intoxicated and at this point the dirt bike was not visible to this officer. I could see tracks from it leading to the rear of the home.

I left [REDACTED] home and went to speak to Officer Ferrara at the [REDACTED] Cemetery. At this point the time was approximately 0400 hours. While there I heard a very loud engine revving and screaming noise coming from [REDACTED] residence. I drove back to the house and observed [REDACTED] run from a truck in the driveway back into the house. I knocked at the door however [REDACTED] refused to answer. I drove up the street and waited for [REDACTED] to come out of his house.

At 0416 hours [REDACTED] came out of his house screaming loud enough for me to hear him down the street. [REDACTED] revved the engine of the truck and then quickly ran back into the house.

At 0417 hours [REDACTED] again came out of his house, revved his engine while screaming and again ran back inside. Both time he did this neither officer Ferrara or myself were able to catch [REDACTED] before he retreated into his house.

At 0426 hours [REDACTED] again emerged from his home, revved the engine of the truck while screaming and again ran back inside. I again knocked at the door and tried to speak to [REDACTED] however he refused to answer.

I advised the dispatcher and Officer Ferrara that I was going to the station to prepare a warrant to arrest [REDACTED]. As I was arriving at the station Officer Ferrara radioed that [REDACTED] was again outside and that neighbors from the area

were coming out to confront him. Officer Ferrara stated that one of the persons may have a Taser device.

I responded back to the area and advised [REDACTED] that he was under arrest. As I was speaking to [REDACTED] the female [REDACTED] was originally on the porch with and his sister [REDACTED] were out in front of the house demanding to know why I was arresting [REDACTED]. Both females were irate and loud. [REDACTED] girlfriend [REDACTED] began screaming extremely loudly demanding this officers name and demanding that [REDACTED] be read his rights. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were ordered to stay back, not interfere and to be quiet. Neither would be compliant.

Once [REDACTED] was secured in a cruiser he was transported to the police station and processed for Disorderly Conduct as well as Noise in the Nighttime. [REDACTED] remained defiant and refused to provide a sample of his breath. This officer could detect a strong odor of intoxicating beverages coming from [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] was placed in a cell and a screener from United Counseling was summoned. [REDACTED] was advised that he was being screened due to his intoxication. [REDACTED] eventually provided a sample of his breath and had a result of .132%. UCS ordered [REDACTED] be held until he was sober.

Officer Ferrara advised me that he had observed the dirt bike [REDACTED] was driving in the rear of the home.

While [REDACTED] was in the cell I could see on the monitor screen that he was attempting to get a drink from the sink. At the time of his arrest a water main break had occurred outside the station and there was no running water. [REDACTED] was provided with fresh drinking water from the water cooler at the station. I observed [REDACTED] consume the water in the cell.

While dealing with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] came to the police station wanting to give statements about being threatened by the neighbor with the electronic control device. Both demanded that this officer stop what he was doing and attend to them. I advised both females that their statements would be taken at a later time due to the issues with [REDACTED] and the need to monitor him. [REDACTED] remained belligerent and began recording this officer after not getting her way. I advised both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] that there actions at the house and at the police station could get them arrested. Both demanded to file a complaint against this officer for threatening to arrest them. Both females appeared to be intoxicated. Both females were later provided with statement paper and advised to complete it for this officer. Both females left the the papers and have not returned. [REDACTED] advised me that [REDACTED] was revving the motor of the truck parked in the driveway.

Later in the morning [REDACTED] again began to act out in the cell by banging on the walls and putting the mattress against the door. [REDACTED] had to be moved the holding cell used for persons out of control. [REDACTED] was later released once sober.

During the incidents at [REDACTED] home there was a total of 8 neighbors that called a total of 14 times to report the noise [REDACTED] was causing. The issues with [REDACTED] and noise in the neighborhood is constant and ongoing.

A check of [REDACTED] criminal history revealed that he has convictions for Simple Assault on 7-7-2017, DUI #1 on 9-5-2012, DLS on 10-24-2011, Disorderly Conduct on 7-7-2010, Possession of Marijuana on 7-1-2009, 3-21-2005, DLS on

2-25-2009, 7-17-2007, Alcohol Possession by a minor on 12-6-2005, 6-20-2005,
2-1-2005 and Unlawful Mischief on 2-1-2005.

On Saturday, October 13, 2018, at approximately 0017 hours, I was dispatched to [REDACTED] for a report of someone knocking on the front door of the residence and running away. Sgt. Stemp responded as well.

As I was responding Sgt. Stemp advised he encountered a group of approximately six juveniles near the intersection of [REDACTED] and Main St. Sgt. Stemp attempted to speak with the juveniles, but they were uncooperative and continued to walk west on Main St. I located a group of six juveniles on Main St. near Stewart's Bread and Butter. I asked the group to stop so I could speak with them. As I was speaking with them, they each identified themselves verbally as [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I asked the group where they were coming from. [REDACTED] appointed himself as the speaker for the group, and stated that they were walking from a residence on the lower end of [REDACTED] where one of them lived. I explained why I was responding to the area and asked if they knew anything about it, or if they had seen anyone else in the area. [REDACTED] stated they did not do anything, and have not seen anyone else around. I advised the group that I would be checking the camera system at the residence, and if I needed to, I would find them to speak with them again. [REDACTED] stated that he would wait for me to review the video and then I can find him to tell him he was not on video. [REDACTED] stated they would be going to his residence located at [REDACTED].

I continued my response to [REDACTED] and did not observe anyone else in the area. I spoke with the complainant, James Lawton DOB [REDACTED]. Lawton stated he had just turned the lights off in his residence to prepare to go to bed, and moments later he heard a knocking on his front door. Lawton further stated that he was able to catch a glimpse of someone with blonde hair running away. Due to observing the blonde hair, Lawton stated he believed it was [REDACTED], who he has had problems with for approximately 6 months. Lawton advised that they have a trail camera set up at their front door that may have captured an image of who knocked on the door.

Lawton invited me into the residence where I met with his wife, Ruqaiyah Morris DOB [REDACTED]. Morris stated she would review the footage captured by the trail camera. Morris was able to locate two still photos that showed someone as they approached the door and as they were running away. Neither of these photos were of good enough quality to be able to identify who it may have been.

I advised Morris that the quality of the photos she supplied were not of good quality. Morris acknowledged this, and stated they may invest in a higher quality security camera system. I recommended that they adjust the view of the trail camera in the mean time to possibly make it more effective.

This ends my involvement.

On Monday, October 15th, 2018, at approximately 1553 hours, I was dispatched to ██████████ the ██████████ Cemetery in Bennington VT, for a report of vandalism to gravestones. Town maintenance employees advised that the damage was discovered on Sunday.

Upon arrival, approximately 20 gravestones were seen vandalized in the southern end of the cemetery near the residence of ██████████. Multiple grave stones were found pushed off the stone base and toppled over into the grass. At least one gravestone was found broken into pieces. Pictures were taken of the vandalized gravestones and burned to a CD.

It was discovered that early Saturday morning, (10/13/2018) at approximately 0017 hours, residents of ██████████ called the Bennington Police Department to report juveniles knocking on the door and then running away, the complainant advised that he believed one of the juveniles was ██████████ dob ██████████

Officer Ferrara made contact with a group of juveniles at the intersection of ██████████ and Main Street and identified the juveniles. Among the juveniles was ██████████ and ██████████

On Wednesday, October 17th, 2018, I traveled to ██████████ and spoke with ██████████ with his parents present. ██████████ advised that he was home Friday night into Saturday. ██████████ parents collaborated his story and explained that ██████████ is not allowed out of the house at night anymore after ██████████ was found to be part of the juveniles responsible for "ding-dong-ditching" the households of ██████████. ██████████ advised that he did not know anything about the continued "ding-dong-ditching" on ██████████ or the vandalism to the cemetery.

On October 17th, 2018, I also spoke with ██████████ with his step-father present. ██████████ was also found to be part of the "ding-dong-ditching" incident from September 22nd, 2018. ██████████ explained that he was visiting his friend in Woodford, VT Friday night (10/12/2018) into Saturday and was out of town at the time of the vandalism and "ding-dong-ditching". ██████████ advised that he had received a voicemail message from ██████████ advising that someone had "ding-dong-ditched" her house again and that she believed ██████████ was responsible. ██████████ explained that ██████████ knows ██████████ outside of the "ding-dong-ditching" incident on September 22nd, 2018. ██████████ told me that he texted ██████████ dob ██████████ on Saturday and asked him if he was responsible for the "ding-dong ditching" early Saturday morning. ██████████ advised that ██████████ texted him back and told him that he was not there or responsible for the "ding-dong-ditching".

After speaking with ██████████, I then traveled to ██████████ and spoke with ██████████ with his mother present. ██████████ denied "ding-dong-ditching" the ██████████ houses in the early morning hours of Saturday 10/13/2018 or causing damage to any gravestones. ██████████ advised that he

was visiting a friend at their house on [REDACTED] in the [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] or at "the bottom hill" of [REDACTED] as [REDACTED] referred. [REDACTED] explained that he was not near the cemetery or residents. [REDACTED] refused to provide names of any of the juveniles that were with him at this time.

This case remains open.

On Monday, October 22nd, 2018, I traveled to [REDACTED], in Bennington VT and served a No Trespass Order (for the Bennington Village Cemetery located at [REDACTED] on [REDACTED], with his mother, [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED] present. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] refused to sign the trespass order or accept it, stating the police were harassing [REDACTED] and his friends. [REDACTED] advised that her lawyer told her to stop signing paperwork. [REDACTED] was severed the No Trespass Order, and on the signature line "refused to sign" was written in. The trespass order was then placed on the front door of the residence.

I then traveled to [REDACTED] to issue a No Trespass Order (for the [REDACTED] Cemetery) on [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was not at this residence and his mother's boyfriend advised that he was staying at his father's residence for the night. I then traveled to [REDACTED] dad [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED] residence at [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was not at the Main Street residence and no one knew where [REDACTED] was.

At the residence of [REDACTED] I spoke with [REDACTED] and his father [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was issued a No Trespass Order to stay out of the [REDACTED] Cemetery. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] both signed and accepted the Order.

On this date, I also traveled to [REDACTED] and spoke with [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED] the father of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised that he was the guardian of [REDACTED] and did not know where [REDACTED] was. [REDACTED] signed and accepted the No Trespass Order (for the Bennington Village Cemetery) on [REDACTED] behalf.

I also traveled to [REDACTED] and spoke with [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED] with his mother [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED] present. [REDACTED] and his mother [REDACTED] signed and accepted the No Trespass Order for the Bennington Village Cemetery.

[REDACTED] told me that on Friday night (10/12/2018), he was hanging out with [REDACTED] and another high schooler by the name of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] advised that he did not know [REDACTED] last name but advised that he was a junior or senior at Mount Anthony Union High School. [REDACTED] name was later determined to be [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] explained that he was walking the trail from the Beech Street Ball field to [REDACTED], with the four boys. [REDACTED] advised that [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED] was not present at this time. [REDACTED] told me that after the boys got to [REDACTED] from the trail, they entered the Bennington Village Cemetery. [REDACTED] advised that he saw [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] pushing gravestones over starting from the back and working their way forward. [REDACTED] said that he was standing with [REDACTED] in the back and the two of them [REDACTED] were telling [REDACTED] to stop. [REDACTED] explained that [REDACTED] was laughing as he was pushing the gravestones over. [REDACTED] told me that he watched [REDACTED] and

push over approximately 16 gravestones in the cemetery.

explained that after the vandalism occurred the five juveniles walked back down the trail. advised that messaged the boys advising them that he was at Mincers gas station located at the intersection of Beech Street and Main Street. explained that he ran with to the gas station to meet up with and left and behind on the trail. advised that he was separated from and " " for approximately 20 minutes.

said that when the six boys reunited, were laughing and told the others that they had "ding-dong-ditched" a house on . said the boys did not say which house they "ding-dong-ditched" but advised that it occurred when and himself ran to meet up with .

It should be noted that on Saturday October 13th, 2018, at approximately 0017 hours an incident was reported at , in which the complainant advised juveniles were knocking on his door and then running away. The complainant reported that he believed one of them was because of blonde hair.

On this date (10/22/2018) I traveled to and spoke with James Lawton dob and Ruquiyah Morris dob . James told me that some of the juveniles that were involved in the prior "ding-dong-ditching" incidents at his house had returned on Saturday October 13th, 2018 at 12:15 am. James advised that he recognized the person who knocked on his door to be . James said he saw run away after knocking on his door and then go to his neighbor, dob house and knock on her door.

James explained that he recognized because he has distinctive blonde hair. James told me that he knows lives down the road and often sees walking by his house. James told me that was the only one that knocked on his and door and advised that two other juveniles were watching in the cemetery.

James Lawton was able to capture two images from a trail camera he mounted near his front door of . Although the pictures are blurry, a blurry image of a juvenile with blonde hair is seen knocking on the front door and in the other picture the same juvenile is seen running away from the house.

James Lawton provided me with a sworn written statement, describing the events and explaining that was the juvenile responsible.

It should be noted that on September 22nd, 2018, was also issued a No Trespass Order for and on September 24th, 2018, was issued a No Trespass Order for (James Lawton's residence).

On Tuesday, October 23rd, 2018, came to the Bennington Police Department and his father, dob . In the interview, denied being in the cemetery on the night of October 13th, 2018. told me that he was hanging out with . said that he has only been in the Bennington Village Cemetery two times, once for the prior "ding-dong-ditching" where the police were involved and another time with . told me that he does not know who did the vandalism to the

cemetery but advised that he did know who did the "ding-dong ditching" on October 13th, 2018. When asked who was responsible for the "ding-dong-ditching", [REDACTED] would not give up anyone's name.

[REDACTED] was issued a No Trespass Order for the Bennington Village Cemetery [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was also issued a juvenile citation ordering himself and his father into Bennington Unit Family Division on Thursday, December 13th, 2018, at 2pm to face the charges of vandalism to the Bennington Village Cemetery located at [REDACTED].

On Tuesday, October 23rd, 2018, [REDACTED] was picked up by the Bennington Police Department for a non-related Juvenile Pickup Order. [REDACTED] was unable to be interviewed by the Bennington Police Department due to lack of guardians present. [REDACTED] DCF worker was uncooperative and advised [REDACTED] to not speak with Police.

On Tuesday, October 23rd, 2018, [REDACTED] also came to the Bennington Police Department with his father [REDACTED] dob [REDACTED] to be interviewed. [REDACTED] told me that on the night of the vandalism (10/13/2018) [REDACTED] was staying at his girlfriends house at [REDACTED] Street. [REDACTED] advised that the last time he was at the cemetery was the end of September. [REDACTED] denied being a part of the vandalism and was adamant about knowing know brought his name into it. [REDACTED] advised that he would only talk further if he was told the person or person who brought his name up.

[REDACTED] was issued a No Trespass Order for the Bennington Village Cemetery and a juvenile citation ordering himself and his father into Bennington Unit Family Division on Thursday, December 13th, 2018, at 2pm to face the charges of vandalism to the Bennington Village Cemetery located at [REDACTED].

At 1948 hours, on October 23rd, 2018, I received a message from Detective Larry Cole, the message consisted of three screenshots from facebook messenger. In the three screenshots, it shows a message from [REDACTED] ([REDACTED] father) stating, "Just brought [REDACTED] to the police station signed all the papers and on the way home he broke down crying about not being a rat but it was [REDACTED] and his buddies that did it is the talk of all the kids he was bragging I'm letting you know because this is serious ty and I think the name is right u prob know who I am talking about."

This ends my involvement.

No persons were located, no persons could be heard and there was no indication that persons were in the area. This officer stayed hidden in the area until approximately 0149 hours. No persons were observed in the area other than a few vehicles driving on [REDACTED]. This officer checked both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] homes to ensure no persons were in the yards or near the properties.

On or about November 14, 2018, Chief Doucette directed me to look into to the whereabouts of the paper materials which was left that Democratic Headquarters in Bennington, in October of 2016. I located 2 newspaper articles on-line which indicted the materials were reportedly sent to the US Attorney General's Office.

I then made contact with James Lawton by telephone and arranged a meeting with him on November 14th at 2:00pm, in an effort to gather any other information and/or printed material. James arrived at the station prior to 2:00pm, however I was at court with a prisoner. I attempted to contact him at approximately 2:05pm, however his phone went to voicemail. I later spoke with Kiah about 2:20pm and was advised she was unable to meet with me as she had to pick up her son at school at 3:00pm. I provided Kiah with my personal cell phone number and asked to contact me with an alternate time to meet.

On November 16, 2018, Chief Doucette directed me to make contact with [REDACTED] to confirm the whereabouts of the material. While checking CAD in order to obtain a phone number for [REDACTED], I discovered he was the complainant in incident #16BN07031. [REDACTED] reported the paper material was located by him on October 11, 2016 at approximately 09:30am that was apparently slid under the door at the headquarters at 432 Main Street.

[REDACTED] subsequently contacted the Attorney General's Office; who advised him to contact the Bennington Police and report the incident, which he did on October 12, 2016 at approximately 09:34am.

Officer Thomson was the responsible officer for the incident and took the materials and placed them into temporary evidence, which were later logged into deep evidence.

On November 16, 2018, I scanned and emailed copies of the printed material left at the headquarters to Deputy Attorney General Doyle.

On November 19th, I scheduled a meeting with Kiah on November 20th at 9:00am. On November 20th, Kiah emailed me photos of damage to a red Ford vehicle and storage shed, apparently a result of a paint ball gun. Kiah and I met at the station on November 20th.

Kiah was shown the 4-4"x6" photographs which were left at the Democratic Headquarters. Kiah told me her husband saw these images on Misch's Instragram page at some time around the time the material was left at the headquarters. Kiah stated Misch's picture was in the background or foreground on the page. Kiah said this was the extent of the additional information she could recall.

I noticed an indicia on all 4 photos of Shutterfly.com. I attempt to gain information from then, but was placed on terminal hold.
