I've checked with the Vermont Senate and Vermont House of Representatives. I've sent them public records requests.

They have no records of the claims you have made, on behalf of the Vermont Attorney General, regarding some transfer of authority from the Vermont Attorney General to the Vermont Secretary of State over enforcement authority of nursing licensure.

As far as the law is concerned, the Vermont State Board of Nursing's regulatory authority (licensing) and jurisdiction (nursing), remain intact.

Please amend your response to my public records request, on behalf of the Vermont Attorney General, to include the records of the Vermont Attorney General's former statutory authority, now transferred to the Vermont Secretary of State, which claim did/does exist.
