I have received another correspondence from Charity. It asks about the meaning of "historical" repeatedly. The reference is to statements made in prior correspondence from Charity, on behalf of the Vermont Attorney General, which claim that a document found on a provided web link has some sort of historical information. I am just requesting records in support of the claim that the documents from the web link actually provide an historical account of some events which actually took place.

I have yet to receive any response from the Vermont Archives and Records, since their initial denial, of their custodianship of the Vermont Attorney General's licensing records. As previously stated, the Vermont records re: licensing of nurses, both before and after 2003, are clearly in the custody of the Vermont State Board of Nursing. Unfortunately, someone other than the Vermont State Board of Nursing has added records and claims which are not those of that agency to the Vermont State Board of Nursing's webpage. I submitted a complaint to the Vermont Attorney General regarding the crime, and have received a refusal to investigate, but no identity of the offending party. Do you know who, other than the Vermont State Board of Nursing has posted fraudulent information on the Board's webpage about me?

Also, I am not referring to an attorney assigned by the OPR to prosecute cases before a board, "State Prosecution Attorney" is an alleged governmental official who prosecutes "State" cases. Please confer with Gabriel Gilman for further information regarding the official and "Office of the State Prosecuting Attorneys" of which the alleged official is an officer of.

I have received correspondence from a staff member of the Vermont Judicial Branch which claims that Vermont court officers and staff are "generally understood" not to be subject to certain Vermont laws. I have requested records supporting the claim from them, and obviously, I am requesting the complementary records from the Vermont Attorney General as corroboration.

I am unclear regarding the responses I have received concerning "Judge Belcher". You sent me the correspondence identifying "Judge Belcher", but seem unable to support the existence of such a judge.

Please provide the basis for your claims of a “Judge Belcher” as there appears to be no supporting records.
