Pursuant to the state open records law Vt. Stat. Ann. Tit. 1, Secs. 315 to 320, I write to request access to and a copy of an agreement or contract between the University of Vermont and the Burlington Police Department. Some names/organizations that could be linked to this are the University of Vermont, the Burlington Police Department, UVM Police, Daniel Mark Fogel, Tom Sullivan, Michael Schirling. If your agency does not maintain these public records, please let me know who does and include the proper custodian's name and address.

I agree to pay any reasonable copying and postage fees of not more than \$10. If the cost would be greater than this amount, please notify me. Please provide a receipt indicating the charges for each document.

As provided by the open records law, I will expect your response within three (3) business days. See Vt. Stat. Ann. Tit 1, Sec. 318(a)(1).

If you choose to deny this request, please provide a written explanation for the denial including a reference to the specific statutory exemption(s) upon which you rely. Also, please provide all segregable portions of otherwise exempt material.

I would note that violation of the open records law can result in the award of litigation costs and reasonable attorney fees. See Vt. Stat. Ann. Tit. 1, Sec. 319(d). The law also states that disciplinary action can be taken against an employee who arbitrarily or capriciously withholds public records. See Sec. 320.
