Charity,

I've submitted public records requests to the Vermont Judiciary regarding the link you sent me.

The Vermont Judiciary has certified that no records of such case or dispute exist between the Vermont Office of Professional and/or the State of Vermont; no "historical" records or otherwise.

I've never been in any such case or dispute, to my knowledge, either.

Unfortunately, the statutes you cited contain no grant of regulatory authority (licensing) to the Vermont Secretary of State. This has been confirmed by the Vermont Legislature. Perhaps the Vermont Attorney General would like to be more specific in his claims?

Would the Vermont Attorney General care to amend his response? If not, please accept this as my appeal of denial of my public records requests.
