They can't insulate themselves so they get hypothermia and their body and their organs stop working normally. Oil destroys the insulating ability of fur-bearing mammals, such as sea otters, and the water repellency of a bird's feathers, thus exposing these creatures to the harsh elements.

Reason 2 oil is harmful to the environment and toxic to the environment. If you get oil on a coral reef the coral dies and impedes their reproduction growth and behavior. The entire reef's ecosystem suffers from oil spills and kills all the fish, crab, other marine invertebrates that live close to the coral reef. Spilled oil can harm the environment in several ways, including the physical damages that directly impact wildlife and their habitats.

Reason 3 Studies of biomarkers have uncovered irreparable harm to humans exposed to oil and gas from spills. These effects can be grouped into respiratory damage, liver damage, decreased immunity, increased cancer risk, reproductive damage and higher levels of some toxics (hydrocarbons and heavy metals). Oil can cause skin rashes, dermatitis, blood anemia, headaches, tremors, and skin cancer.
